TOWN OF DENNIS

Article 61. To see if the town will vote to amend the Town of Dennis Building Code By-Law under A. GENERAL, by adding a new Section numbered 10, titled OCCUPANCY, as follows: Section 10. OCCUPANCY. No person shall occupy or use for living, commercial, business or manufacturing purposes any building or alteration thereto requiring a building permit, until a certificate of occupancy shall have been issued by the Building Inspector.

Article 61. No recommendation.

Article 61A To see if the town will vote to amend the Town of Dennis Building Code By-law under B. CONSTRUCTION REGULATIONS, Section 8, FEES FOR PERMITS, by changing the amounts shown from Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each residential permit to Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and from Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each commercial permit to Twenty Dollars (\$20.00).

Article 61A. No recommendation.

Article 62. To see if the town will vote to transfer the care, custody, management and control of the following described parcel of land from the School Committee of the Town of Dennis to the Recreation Commission of the Town of Dennis for the purpose of erecting and maintaining tennis courts or do anything in relation thereto. Said land containing approximately 48,000 square feet is bounded and described as follows: Southerly by Old Chatham Road, Westerly and Northerly by Town of Dennis and Easterly by the Exit Road of the Wixon School being shown on Sketch Plan of land in East Dennis for the Town of Dennis Recreation Commission showing area at the Wixon School for the proposed building of four tennis courts. Dated December 1972 and signed by Ira R. Thacher, Jr. Reg. Land Surveyor.

Article 62. No recommendation.

Article 63. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate or take from available funds a sum of money not to exceed \$40,000 for the purpose of constructing and maintaining municipal tennis courts at the Wixon School so called or do anything in relation thereto.

Article 63. Recommend to indefinitely postpone.
